Council News - Report from the Clerk

Dear All,

Hopefully by the time these notes reach you, Spring will be in full bloom!

This might be a good chance to visit the Common if you haven't done so recently. Council has been doing a great amount of work there in addition to the day-to day maintenance of the Woods. This includes clearing of the land near the car parking area, which will have picnic benches and seating installed within the next few months. From here there is to be a disabled access to the newly cleared Pit. We are also working on improving the heather beds.

To improve access to the Common itself, we are funding a new TROD (a medium grade pavement like the ones on Beach Rd) from the by-pass to the Common. This will mean that those with pushchairs and wheelchairs will have pedestrian access from the Village into the heart of the Common, as well as improved safety on the way down Beach Rd.

You will have noticed that the replacement street lighting in the Village is now complete. This has been a major project for Council and we are delighted that the cost savings predicted are beginning to come on stream. We are aware of two or three areas where we need to improve the provision, and this is currently being considered.

As you will have realised from the endless press coverage, elections are imminent. As well as the parliamentary one there are Borough and Parish elections. If you are interested in standing for either of these Councils, applications must be received at King's Lynn by April 9th. I can provide further information.

Council is working to improve its communication with the Village. We are soon to be upgrading our website to become a really useful tool for presenting information, and we have now a Facebook page which enables up to the minute news and responses from villagers – please do visit and register.

As last year we will be holding Open Meetings to showcase all of Council's activities over the last year and our future projects. These meetings are on April 8th (6-9pm) and April 11th (2-5pm) in the Memorial Hall. We are extending an invitation to take part at both of these meetings to other groups within the Village. It is an opportunity for you to advertise what you do, and possibly recruit new members. If you would like to do so, please contact me.

It would also be a great help to have contact addresses for all such groups so I can share information as well. If you forward details of events to me, we can also help with public awareness.

It is over two years since I became Parish Clerk in Snettisham. During that time considerable effort has been spent by Council dealing with issues from the past. These are now in the past, and we look forward to being able to work with you all now on building a rosy future for our wonderful Village.

Environment Agency Notice regarding Flood Warning Service Improvements

From 25th February your Flood Warning Service has been improved. You will continue to receive Flood Alerts and Flood Warnings from us, however they will now contain information regarding the Precautionary Evacuation Notice (PEN). The PEN is the trigger to emergency services and partner organisations that an evacuation needs to occur between the two lines of defence at Snettisham. Following the 5th December 2013 tidal surge, it was recommended that we should also give this information to members of the public to encourage them to take action. Therefore we have now combined the PEN into the Flood Warning for Snettisham, this means that all organisations and residents receive the same warning.

The Flood Warning for your local area it is called '**Snettisham PEN Flood Warning**'. To reflect the changes to the Flood Warning Service we have changed the footpath signs along the beach at Snettisham (pictured right). There will not be any impact on when or how you receive the Flood Warning or the actions you should take when a Flood Warning is issued. We will still continue to work with emergency services and partner organisations to co-ordinate the evacuation of Snettisham Beach and Beach Road.

We are currently working on updating the PEN road signs to warn members of the public when there is potential tidal flooding. We will update you on progress and when you can expect to see these new road signs.

A Good Reason to go for a Walk



Snettisham Footpath number 35

The parish council's request for a right of way Order for the beach footpath to the RSPB was issued by NCC 2 years ago in Spring 2013. Following some objections, the public inquiry last year confirmed the Order, and Snettisham Parish Council's success means this coastal footpath at Snettisham Beach is now a public right of way, titled Footpath 35.

The footpath starts at Snettisham Beach car park and travels south along the coastal footpath to the RSPB reservation where it joins up with Footpath 29 leading onto Dersingham. Footpath 35 is level on fairly firm shingle, mud free, walking distance is 3/4 mile and it can be extended by walking around the RSPB reserve and back again. NCC have now erected full explanatory right of way signage and directional finger posts just in time for Easter holiday walkers.

Promotion of this newly registered public footpath is essential, enabling everyone to benefit and enjoy the wonderful views across The Wash including the Lincolnshire coast on a clear day. The magnificent displays of flying knot will keep your eye fixed whilst other wonderful sights include the elegant avocets with their amazing sickle shaped beaks and other waders busying themselves on the beach.

To commemorate last year's mass walk, a group of us will be walking along the new footpath on the May Bank Holiday Monday, 4th May. We will meet at 11.00 am from the start of FP35 at the top of the beach car park, and you are most welcome to join us.

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Lynx 35... arriving at a bus stop near you!



You may have noticed a new locally owned bus operator in the area offering a new service through Snettisham.

Lynx, set up by Snettisham born Julian Patterson along with a number of colleagues all of whom have many years experience in the bus business. Julian who is delighted to be operating buses in West Norfolk again said "We're keen to offer the residents of Snettisham a bus service they can be proud of by getting the basics right. We know people want a reliable, punctual, clean and friendly service and that's exactly what we aim to deliver."

The new route stops at the Factory Shop and The Grapes. The service operates northbound towards Heacham and Hunstanton (generally stopping at the Factory Shop at 50 minutes past the hour then The Grapes at 52 minutes past). Southbound it departs around 46 minutes past the hour for most of the day towards Ingoldisthorpe, Dersingham and then direct into King's Lynn down the northern by-pass.

Concessionary passes are accepted for free travel from 0930hrs Monday-Friday and all day at weekends. Lynx also offers discounted travel before 0930hrs for concessionary pass holders too.

The car boot sales will take place this year starting on 1st May; dates will be given out on a first come basis, and the charge this year has been dropped to £70 with no extra charge for the cooker.

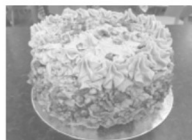
