Hello from all of us.

Just to let you know the lottery has now been running successfully for four months. The 1st months prize was £40, the second month was £60 and now it is £70 which consists of a £50 and £20 prize. A few more shareholders and the total prize fund will rise to £80 a month.

The lottery has created £312 for the New Build fund. Don't forget this is a locally run lottery and the chances of winning are approx. 50:1. We would like to take this opportunity to thank all shareholders for their support. If anyone would like to increase their shares or know of anyone interested in gaining a share/shares please contact us. It is only £4 per share per month. We have now found a friendly architect in the village who is drawing up the plans for the New Build. Presently we are searching for an ecologist to survey Jimmy's Field for the planning department and hope to present full plans to the Borough Council within the next few months. The future is looking very bright. We are organising many fund raising events this year for the New Build.

The New Build is designed for the use of everyone in the village. It will enable all children (including those with disabilities) to enjoy inside and outside activities. It will be a fantastic venue for all occasions. Several scout/guide groups have already contacted us regarding using Jimmy's Field this summer for camping and other activities. The New Build will attract groups near and far because of the facilities it will offer.

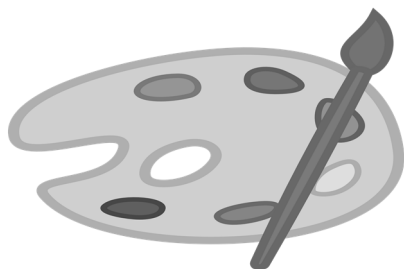
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Snettisham Art Group

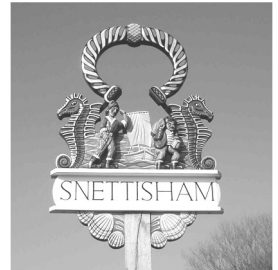
