Numerous anti-fouling signs have been put up around the Village and the Common (where improvement has been seen following a letter, requested by the Parish Council, sent by the Borough to known serial offenders).

It is an offence not to pick up on any open land accessible to the public. We have 19 dog waste bins in the village which cost us over £1,000 per year to have emptied. There is really no excuse!

Unfortunately Ladies Walk remains a problem, caused by a single irresponsible owner, spoiling a much used and attractive part of our village. You know who you are. Please pick up, even when not challenged.

Snettisham Gardening Club

Our meetings are held at the Memorial Hall, Old Church Road, usually on the last Wednesday of the month. Refreshments are served at the meetings which start at 7.30 pm. Membership is currently £5.00 per annum with a payment of £1.00 for most of the monthly meetings, to include tea coffee and biscuits at the meeting. Members also qualify for agreed discounts with some of our local garden produce suppliers. We have various speakers and some outings during the year. A group of us have recently visited Kent and been to Sissinghurst and Leeds Castle, which was enjoyed by all. We also spent a pleasant afternoon nearer home, with tea and cake at Gooderstone Water Gardens near Swaffham.

Open Gardens will be held on Sunday 5 July 1.00 pm until 5.00 pm. There will be refreshments available, details of which will be provided with the maps, which will be available at 17d Old Church Road by kind permission of Mr. Rodney Forster (almost opposite the Rose & Crown pub) at a cost of £2.00 per person. Visitors will be asked to vote for their favourite garden as well as the best window box, hanging basket, water feature and a separate vote for the best vegetable garden, to include for the first time some on the allotments on Bircham Road. All profits from the day will be donated to East Anglia Children's Hospice, our chosen charity for 2015.

The Annual Open Show is on Saturday 25 July 2015 and is open for anyone in the village to take part. The classes are varied and include flowers, vegetables, plants, flower arrangements, cookery, preserves, craft including art and photography. There are also similar classes for Juniors – age ranges 4-6 years, 7-9 years and 10-12 years. There are prizes for 1st and 2nd place in all classes. Trophies and prize monies are given at our Presentation and Social Evening in August. The show will be open to visitors from 1.30 pm. to 4.30 pm once judging is complete and there will be refreshments available. Admission will be via raffle ticket, which will be drawn at 4.00 pm on the day.

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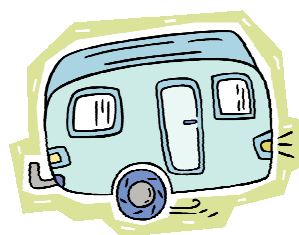
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Snettisham heritage



Snettisham Heritage was formed to celebrate both the heritage of Snettisham Village and its medieval church of St Mary's.

Our long term aim is to provide access to St Mary's Church that is both welcoming and hospitable; to interpret local heritage; celebrate the medieval sacred space and to create a space in the vestry where certain aspects of our local heritage can be exhibited. This room will also be used as a meeting room and for children's work. We propose calling this the Community Room.

To date, there has been a set of 7 interpretation panels created, and put on permanent display in the north west corner of the church. These panels introduce visitors to the church itself and the village whilst also providing information about the surrounding landscape, covering periods from the Stone Age and Bronze Age through to recent centuries. Last year we also had a temporary display of local history related to World War I and currently there is a display relating to World War II, which will remain on view for the rest of the summer. We are grateful to Peter Everingham for compiling these excellent information boards that provide details related to local people during the two world wars.

For the next stage of our project, we are raising funds so that a kitchen/servery can be installed in St Mary's to provide hospitality for visitors and for groups using the church building.

We are so privileged in Snettisham to have such a beautiful church and so much local heritage. St Mary's Church is open every day during British Summer Time and, once again, we plan to offer guided tours of the church over the August Bank Holiday weekend, led by Peter Murray. Please see posters around the village nearer the time to confirm times that these tours will be available. We warmly invite you to come along and learn more about the history of our magnificent medieval church as well as enjoy tea, coffee and cakes. You will be made very welcome.

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Memorial Hall & Playing Field

Since the Trustee's last Newsletter report, we held our AGM in March, and we are pleased to announce a couple of new Trustees.

Playing Field: On the playing field you will notice a container has been placed, lying alongside the Pavilion. This has been purchased to house equipment, which we are in the process of purchasing; it will also be used for storing other implements needed for the upkeep of the surrounding areas of the field, tennis courts and Hall as well as giving the Football Club some storage space. We are also now in the process of improving the quality of the football area after a hard long season with weed killing, re-seeding and feeding.

We are also happy to report that the water level in Barkers Pond is now running lovely. After the dyke was cleared, the plate blocking any silage from the pond into the pipes was accidentally removed, which resulted in part of the old pipe being blocked solid with mud and collapsing. We therefore have had a man hole inserted on the field, which will help in any foreseeable future blockage, and as all can now see the level is much lower. The Trustees are also considering putting a couple of trees up the top of the field behind the football pitch, where the ground is still liable to be wet, hoping that these will help soak up any excess water.

The car boots have started, but the Trustees are still limiting the number of car booters to 100 -120 cars, keeping the vehicles off the football pitch.

There will be a Family Halloween Party on 31st October, time 4-9pm. Ticket £5 per Family.

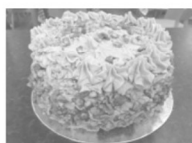
The children's Christmas Party is to be held on Tuesday 22nd December, time 4-8pm. Tickets to remain the same as last year at £4.
